The channel name convention is, e.g.: #day1-mon-slot3a-intro-to-rubin




In BlueJeans, virtual participants should:

Formal Meetings & Reports: twice per year (i.e., 22A and 22B)

The charge sets the composition of the UC.

12 members with at least:

The SAC appoints UC members.

Status of the Rubin User's Committee; synergy between the User's Committee and the SAC - Melissa Graham

"Synergy between the Users Committee and the SAC".

The SAC has no charge for me to cross-reference. But I can be specific about the UC's charged duties.

The Rubin Users Committee...

- "... is charged both with soliciting feedback [about the quality of the data products and the efficacy of the RSP] from the community, and actively using the LSST data and the RSP."
- "... members may also participate in User Acceptance Testing for the RSP".
- "... will regularly report ... with recommendations for science-driven improvements to the LSST data products and the RSP tools and services."

3 ways (I think) the UC's focus and function is different from the SAC's. (and therefore "in synergy" and not "redundant" with the SAC)

- 1. Focused on the data products and the Rubin Science Platform.
- →SAC's purview is more expansive, includes survey strategy, etc.
- 2. Direct communication with the users – Forum, email, surveys, etc.
- →does SAC solicit this too?
- 3. Twice-yearly public reports.
- →SAC reports? more by topic than by time interval?




